Our first dog haul for 2018 is scheduled for January 13th with fifteen dogs ordered. Weather permitting it will go well.

Also, a first for 2018 and for NCGL as a whole is our "For the Love of Dogs" Valentine Gala, Saturday, February 10th. Look for details elsewhere in this newsletter or on the website. It promises to be a successful event which will become an annual fundraiser for us if all goes well - order your tickets today! As you know we dependentirely on adoption fees and donations to keep NCGL going. Adoption fees don't come close to covering all of the veterinarian fees and other expenses.

Our Epie (Superior Epic) has been dealing with a recurring rash inside of her thighs for several months now; she is sure tired of wearing the cone collar. She has been treated for everything from thyroid to body oils with no favourable results. She has been to three different vets, different antibiotics, salves, sprays - nothing helps. Research has me convinced it is caused by too much protein in her diet so we have just started feeding half kibble (26% crude protein) and half canned (8% protein). I will publish results in the next newsletter. During all of this, however, we have discovered that 6mg of Melatonin per feeding for a 60 LB dog will grow peach fuzz on bald thighs in about 6 weeks. We are hoping for a full coat by spring!



Northwest Canadian Greyhound League (NCGL) became a Registered Charity in the year 2000. Our mandate is to rescue and rehome retired racing Greyhounds, owner-surrendered Greyhounds and Greyhound mixes as well as other Sight Hound breeds. Our Board of Directors are all volunteers and a large percentage of our Greyhound owners assist in offering their homes to foster incoming hounds as well as participate in our fundraising activities, such as Meet and Greets in PetSmart stores, picnics, Animal Expos and other events as they arise.

On Saturday, February 10th, 2018 we are holding a major fundraiser "For the Love of Dogs" to raise funds that will go towards our major expense, Veterinary fees. All of the hounds that come into our organization are completely vetted before being adopted out to their approved forever homes. During our 2016 fiscal year NCGL's veterinary expenses amounted to \$17,019.40 and donations received were \$13,426.70. This year-to-date veterinary expenses have already cost NCGL \$14,258.65 and donations are down considerably at

\$5,181.63. Our entire operation depends on donations because the adoption fees seldom cover the veterinary fees paid,

so we have decided to hold this first gala fundraiser.
